Missouri School Administrators Political Action Committee Endorses Mike Kehoe, Republican Candidate for 6th District State Senate Seat

Jefferson City – The Missouri School Administrators Political Action Committee announced its endorsement of Mike Kehoe, a Republican candidate for the 6th District State Senate seat, which includes Callaway, Cole, Miller, Moniteau, and Morgan Counties. The Missouri School Administrators Political Action Committee (MSAPAC) met on June 30th and considered MSAPAC member recommendations regarding endorsements for the August 3, 2010 primary election. MSAPAC is comprised of four statewide school administrator associations, including the Missouri Association of School Administrators (MASA), the Missouri Association of Elementary School Principals (MAESP), the Missouri Association of Secondary School Principals (MASSP), and the Missouri Council of Career and Technical Administrators (MCCTA). MSAPAC was founded in 1991 to provide school administrators with the opportunity to become more involved in the political process through endorsements and contributions to candidates who are strong public education supporters.
